This week...

Music

Last week, we launched our 'Singsation' Choir for KS1. We are starting by looking at some songs we can sing for Christmas. The ukulele club continue to build their skills, learning chords and they are starting to play some simple songs. 'Showstoppers' are enjoying doing their 'Tune Baboon' warm-ups and they are singing some great songs like 'We're Detectives' and 'I Just Want to Sing!'.

Our KS2 choir have absolutely loved singing this term and they gave a great performance of Roller Ghoster in assembly and are now focusing on Christmas songs. The samba band have had a great start and are really getting into the rhythm of what samba music is all about, whilst the recorder players have also made a great start to the year.



Year 3

Year 3 have had a great start back this half term. We are learning in detail about exactly what 'Wonderful things' Mr Howard Carter found in the tomb of Tutankhamun in 1922. We have also learnt the difference between primary and secondary sources. In English, we have loved reading The Egyptian Cinderella and discussing the similarities and differences between it and the original Cinderella and other traditional tales. In maths, we have worked hard at using the inverse to check our answers.
