The curriculum at Broadstone First School is designed to prepare children for a life well lived. Coverage of the EYFS Development Matters Guidance is organised into modules, linking areas where appropriate and beneficial. Early Years modules have focused areas for development where there are opportunities to cover particular aspects within a theme. All areas for development are still taught throughout each module. Additional time is built in to enable assessment and review time.

We follow the Read Write Inc Speed Sounds Phonics scheme to ensure appropriate progression and pace for learning to read. This programme is accompanied by the Read Write Inc reading books to provide matched opportunities for practise and application of phonics when reading.
