This week..

The Link - Onyx and Obsidian

We have been exercising every day in The Link, finding new ways to keep moving. The learners in Onyx class have started every day with the daily mile, running around the track in the playground. We have travelled in different ways such as jumping, skipping and rolling. All learners participate in our daily sensory circuit activities which involves engaging all our sensory systems. Reception

We have been learning about shapes and their properties this week and the children have been using their knowledge to carry out different shape challenges. The children have also been enjoying our new outdoor music area, where they can explore the instruments and sing along to different melodies, as well as try to keep a steady beat. We have shared the story 'Ruby's Worry' and the children have learnt that if they are worried about something, then they can talk to someone about it, to help them feel better. We have spoken to the children about internet safety and the importance of telling an adult if they see something that upsets them. We are all looking forward to the half term break and look forward to welcoming the children back soon.

Year 1

Year 1 used their artistic skills this week to make amazing fish sculptures. Over the past term we have been learning all about what sculptures are and how they are made, thinking carefully about the materials involved in creating them. This week Year 1 created observational drawings of fish and then turned them into sculptures by cutting foam, moulding wire and tearing paper. They turned out brilliantly, especially for a first attempt and we are looking forward to more sculpture making after the half term.

Year 2

Our Year 2 learners have come to the end of their 'Healthy Habits' module this week. They have wowed us in their Quest. On Monday, 5 customers visited the learners to share their design criteria. The children then quickly came up with so many lunch options that met the customer's request. They've been able to articulate what a balanced diet means and how you can stay healthy. We're sure that the customers will love your lunch option ideas. Great job Year 2.

In Maths, we've been using arrays to help us solve multiplication questions. We are also becoming more confident with counting to 100 in our 2s, 5s and 10s. Well done for practicing your counting at home too.

In Reading, we have completed our class read- The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe. For those that have resisted watching the film, you can now watch it as it won't be a spoiler alert! Please ask a Year 2 learner what they thought of the book.

Year 4 - Maiya and Adonia

Broadstone Highway Improvement Works

BCP Council will be carrying out highway improvement works within the Broadstone area. These works form part of the Council's Local Transport Plan, which aims to improve safety and accessibility for all modes of travel within the conurbation. Works include:

- Extending the existing 20 MPH zone, which includes roads between Lower Golf Links Road, Ashwood Drive and Lower Blandford Road
- Infilling the layby on Dunyeats Road outside Whittles Restaurant
- Upgrading the zebra crossing on Dunyeats Road near Broadstone Middle School
- Installing a new zebra crossing on Dunyeats Road near Broadstone recreation grounds

These works will be carried out by BCP Council operatives during week commencing 13 February 2023 and will last approximately 4 weeks.

For the works to be completed this will require temporary two-way traffic signals for times during the installation of the zebra crossing and infilling of the layby. Therefore, to ease congestion we advise parking away from school and walking a small distance.
