Reception

Year 1

Another busy week has been had in Year 1. This week the learners have been finding out all about nouns and adjectives. They have been looking at images from the story 'The Last Wolf' by Mini Grey and writing the nouns and then using adjectives to describe them. They then became super writers and transformed their nouns and adjectives into amazing sentences.

Year 2

Year 2 have loved welcoming Mark Page, a local illustrator, to do a workshop on illustration. Our learners were keen to ask all about life as an artist and were amazed by his beautiful illustrations. We then had a go at drawing our own tiger and they were fantastic! Well done year 2!



Year 3

Year 3 have had a wonderful week punctuating speech, using the inverse to check answers in maths and using transitions and animations on google slides. We have been continuing to learn about different metacognitive strategies by using our prompted response cards to retrieve key learning. Ask a Year 3 learner to show you how they work!

Year 4 learners have been learning to scramble, boil and poach eggs this week. 'Chicken Tim' from Friar Waddon Poultry Farm has donated hundreds of beautiful freshly laid free range eggs for us to cook and they are absolutely delicious! Why not ask your child to prepare breakfast this weekend?
