Stationery Replacement – KS2

As part of our aim to 'Prepare Children for a Life Well Lived', we are always striving to grow responsibility and organisational skills within our children. These two skills are invaluable and transferrable in everyday life. One of the ways we can develop this is by allowing the children to take ownership and responsibility for their own equipment and resources needed in school. It is vital that all learners are properly prepared for school each day. By having the correct equipment, it supports the quality of their outcomes, ability to participate in activities and reduces lost learning time.

To help support the children in taking responsibility for equipment we will be introducing 'Prep for Learning' checklist in Years 3 and 4. These will be found attached at the back of your child's reading log. Each day the children will complete a daily check list, ensuring they have the correct stationery. Your child will be introduced to these this week in class.

As the children's pencil cases stay in school, the Prep for Learning card will inform you if they require any stationery to be replaced. This will be marked on the card with a cross. Should your child need replacement stationery then, we run a stationery shop from our school office. This is a non-profit enterprise and so we will be able to offer stationery to you at a very reasonable price. Should your child need a replacement then please do either come and purchase from the school office or please send your child in with the correct money for them to purchase it themselves from the office in the morning. Please note we are only able to take cash payments.

We are asking all families to work in partnership with us on this and support your child in ensuring they have the correct equipment in school each day. The Prep for Learning cards are a good way to ensure that we have good communication between home and school if equipment has run out or has been lost.
