Year 1

The year one learners in Onyx class have had a brilliant end to their 'Backyard Safari' module. They created some wonderful models of fish and birds which they then showed to their peers in Coral class as part of their class gallery. The learners have managed to join Coral class every week this term for module and have done exceptionally well listening to a different teacher in a busy classroom environment. We have made some great friends in the class and are looking forward to joining in their next module.

In Maths this week, we have introduced measuring. We have been using rulers, remembering to start on 0cm and finding out the height and length of different items.

We are very pleased to see the learners in Onyx class sharing the resources and taking turns independently. They have been using different strategies they have been taught such as using the sand timers, each person having one go and 'first this, next that'. They have problem solved and resolved any conflicts without adult support. Well done to the learners.

Obsidian class have been learning about History. We have explored 'What is History?' and taken a deeper dive into before, after, ancient, new, and old. We started with looking at some old pictures of the school and explored what school looks like today, as well as taking a guess at what the future building will look like.
