



<p>Overview of Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)</p>	<p>The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) for children who receive Free school meals (or have ever received them within the last 6 years 'Ever6') was £1320 with £23 top up per pupil. For Service children (or those who have ever been a service child within the last 5 years 'Ever5') £300. For any child currently in care or who have ever been in care £1900.</p> <p>11% of children in school are eligible for the PPG</p>
<p>How are we accountable?</p>	<p>The pupil premium is designed to address inequality by giving every school and teacher the resources they need to help their most disadvantaged pupils, allowing them the freedom to respond appropriately to individual circumstances.</p> <p>As a school we are accountable for the progress each child makes.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are measure in the following ways: • the attainment of the pupils who attract the funding • the progress made by these pupils • the gap in attainment between disadvantaged pupils and their peers
<p>Looking Back: How was the previous year's allocation spent?</p>	<p>Pupil Premium Grant(PPG) teacher – 2 days a week for 6 weeks approx. £8500 Pastoral Support Worker (PSW) – FT approx. £1631 a month Emotional Literacy Support Assistant(ELSA) teacher 3 afternoons a week Ribbons for anti bullying week Wrist bands for promoting the Castleman way Hardship fund – uniform and trips Extra-Curricular activities 1:1 TA support to settle PPG child each morning School Pupil Tracker yearly subscription.</p>
<p>What was the impact of the funding on our disadvantaged learners?</p>	<p>77% of children who attract the pupil premium grant made expected or better progress. Four children for whom attendance was a concern have now improved attendance rates. Our nurture programmes are oversubscribed and children have developed emotional resilience and are now sustaining better than expected progress and maintain good relationships.</p>

<p>Looking forward: What are our plans to spend the pupil premium in the coming academic year?</p>	<p>Our aim next year is that the Inclusion Leader begins begin the year with a planning meeting with each parent of a child who is eligible for the PPG. This meeting is to ensure that we are working in partnership with parents and meeting their expectations. Together we will put the child at the centre of our planning and work in partnership to ensure that each child received the provision that they need. This provision might include: 1:1, pastoral support, ELSA, Hardship funding, Extra-curricular activities.</p>
