



<p>Overview of Sports Premium</p>	<p>The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.</p> <p>For example, funding can be used to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • hire specialist PE teachers • hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers • provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport • support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and <u>Change4Life</u> clubs • run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the <u>School Games</u> • run sports activities with other schools
<p>How are we accountable?</p>	<p>Since September 2013, Ofsted inspections report on how primary schools spend their PE and sport premium funding.</p>
<p>Looking Back: How was the previous year's allocation spent?</p>	<p>Schools receive £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil. In 2014-15 Broadstone First School received £9,225.</p> <p>This was allocated towards:</p> <p><u>Term 1</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hire of Sports facility and specialised Sports Coaches to deliver high-quality PE lessons for Years 1-4 (£1,550) <p><u>Term 2</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hire of highly-skilled Sports Coaches to deliver structured and differentiated PE lessons for Years R-4 to meet curriculum standards (£2,700) • Purchase of gymnastics equipment to be used during curriculum lessons and after-school clubs (£1,100) • After-school CPD opportunity for teaching staff delivered by specialist Sports Coach (£40) <p><u>Term 3</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hire of highly-skilled Sports Coaches to deliver structured and differentiated PE lessons for Years R-4 to meet curriculum standards. Provision made for Assessment of pupils during these sessions (£2,500) • Purchase of 15 basketballs to facilitate learning in Year 3 PE sessions during 'Space Jam' topic (£80) • Hire of circus company (J Miller Circus) to facilitate learning in Year 4 topic sessions during 'The Big Top' (£150) • Netball tournament – £20 for transport • Sports Day – Equipment costs = £300, sports coaches for the co ordination of the activities on the day £90 • Boscome Coastal Beach trip (Get into sport) – A new way of introducing children to the beach through sport. This consists of 4 sporting activities over 2 hours with an added extra of sandcastle building. This day was planned for Y3 -4. Costing £630 for the programme and coach hire for the day. <p>TOTAL SPEND:- £9140</p>



What was the impact of the funding?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Pupils have developed their physical skills and abilities through participation in weekly PE sessions and extra-curricular activities• Pupils progress has increased as a result of highly differentiated and sufficiently challenging teaching• Pupils have shown increased engagement and confidence during weekly PE sessions• All pupils involved in extra-curricular gymnastics have been awarded the Level 8 British Gymnastics badge• As a result of their enjoyment of the circus workshop, pupils in Year 4 have made further progress in other curriculum areas such as Literacy and ICT – as demonstrated in the Yr 4 Learning journals and other recorded learning.
Total amount allocated for the coming academic year.	In 2015-16 the school is likely to receive £9225 PE and sport premium funding.
Looking forward: What are our plans to spend the sports premium in the coming academic year?	This funding could be allocated towards: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Continued funding for Specialised Sports Coaches (approximately £7,500)• Further CPD training opportunities for staff in Gymnastics and Dance (approximately £300)• CPD training for new PE Subject leader (approximately £100)• Update of equipment and resources for PE and Sport, including storage facilities as required (approximately £900)• Set up of a series of sporting leagues / competitions involving other local schools (approximately £500)
